#### Communications

#### Education

After careful research we decided to use Zoom Webinar for our education programs. It streamlined our registration, reminder and follow-up email efforts and recordkeeping. We also utilized Google Forms to enable us to do electronic education registrations, evaluation forms and surveys. We delivered 3 ambitious series of webinars for a total of 15.5 CEUs around the themes of Underserved Populations, COVID, and Auditing. All 15 of the webinars received high marks on the evaluations. We also planned a virtual Annual Meeting with 5 CEUs on Hot Topics in HIM. At our picnic in August, we offered 1.0 CEU for the FY2021 ICD-10-CM/PCS and Coding Guidelines update – Hollywood Squares style.

#### **Special Interest Groups (SIGs):**

The **Long-Term Care (LTC) SIG** continues to be very active, holding meetings the third Tuesday of the month via. It is a roundtable session at which HIM professionals working in the LTC setting come together to discuss DOH surveys, PACS and other audit requests, ROI regulatory changes, CMS changes and complex coding cases. Meeting are two hours with 1.0 or 2.0 CEU being offered depending on the length of the meeting and the contents of round table discussion.

The **Coders SIG** met quarterly via Zoom. We held 3 meetings so far this year. The SIG hopes to meet again in June. Surveys were sent out to solicit SIG attendees input on topics, presenters, and convenient times for the meetings. #### **Student Engagement**

RRHIMA has a **student representative** on its Board of Directors to help RRHIMA keep in touch and be of assistance to the students in our region's HIM program. This year our student representative is Penny Hankins from MCC, and she reports that the senior Health Information Technology (HIT) students have done well studying virtually during COVID and are preparing for graduation in a few weeks from Monroe Community College (MCC). Most will be taking their RHIT exams this summer and hope to be gainfully employed by Fall 2021. This year's HIT Club ran a successful hat and mitten drive in the winter, collecting more hats and mittens than any other club in past years. The club also held its annual "Be the Match" Bone Marrow Drive virtually for the first time ever and it was a success.



The RRHIMA BOD met virtually with the MCC senior class in February to describe our personal HIM journeys and to talk about the importance of participating in our professional associations.

It is with a heavy heart that we announce that MCC's HIT program is closing due to the inability to find a Program Director. Members of this year's freshman class will be allowed to graduate if they complete the program by May 2022, but there will be no more graduations from the MCC HIT program after May of 2022.

#### Awards

We were proud to give out our **Sharon Insero Academic Award** to Penny Hankins who is graduating the program at MCC this spring.



## Accomplishments

- The BOD met monthly for board meetings plus had 2 extra planning meetings.
- Made a successful shift to Zoom Meeting and Zoom Webinar which enabled us to provide a full schedule of education sessions and hold virtual BOD and Business Meetings.
- Moved all webinar and meeting registration, evaluation forms and CE certificates online.
- Increased our membership by almost 10%.
- Held the 2021 Election online with a 52% participation rate.
- Updated our Bylaws in January 2021.
- Held a picnic in August and had 22 people attend it was the first and only time we got together in person during COVID. We also did a coding update during the picnic for 1 CEU.
- Held 15 Education Webinars for 15.5 CEUs with between 35-60 registrants for each webinar series.
- Held 3 Coder Special Interest Group Meetings (with 1 CEU awarded at each)
- Held monthly LTC Special Interest Group Meetings (with 1-2 CEU awarded at each).
- Started a Newcomers Special Interest Group for students, recent grads, newcomers to the area. It meets monthly and includes a presentation on topics of interest to the group, such as exam prep, job hunting tips and resume reviews.
- Celebrated HIP week in October 2020 and again in April 2021 with games, activities, prizes, and member spotlights
- Provided RRHIMA highlights and Member Spotlights to NYHIMA for every issue of PERSPECTIVES
- The BOD met virtually with the senior class from Monroe Community College to talk about our person HIM journeys, and RRHIMA, and to answer their questions.
- Awarded Penny Hankins, a graduating senior from the HIT program at Monroe Community College with the Sharon Insero Academic Award for 2021.
- Held our 2021 (Virtual) Annual Meeting May 11-13, 2021 11am-1pm each day for 5 CEU.
